



# UNHGA-DISEC

The day one of the committee started with the opening ceremony, where the conference was declared open.

The first GSL was delivered by the delegate of New Zealand. The delegate in the speech requested de-escalation of tensions and the protection of their civilians, which was their utmost priority. The Delegate of India pointed out that the delegate had referred to “North Korea” instead of the official term “DPRK” according to the freeze date. A delegate questioned how they could justify the conflict as a civil war; the Delegate of New Zealand argued that the conflict was originally a civil war.

The Delegation of Japan mentioned in their speech that the UN Charter had not been properly respected and argued that the invasion across the 38th parallel was unjustified. Questions were raised in committee regarding under which international law such an invasion could be considered legal. The discussions also included accusations about the use of chemical or biochemical weapons, though some delegates denied these allegations and claimed resources were only being used to defend a socialist nation.

The DPRK delegation defended its position using Article 51 of the UN Charter, claiming the right to self-defence. However, clarification was given that Article 51 applies only to recognised UN member states, and concerns were raised over the DPRK’s international recognition. Turkey argued that DPRK functioned jointly with the ROK government and therefore fell under the UN Charter. Belgium questioned Article 206 while supporting the UN Charter.

The USSR was questioned about their stance against the USA. The delegate answered that they do not have to justify whatever they are doing because the things that they are doing are being done inside their territories. The Delegate of the USSR responded by stating that their actions were aimed at protecting their territories and civilians. They also argued that the USSR had control over security matters due to the ongoing conflict.

Columbia raised concerns about international sovereignty and criticised aggressive actions by the USSR.

The Delegate of Mexico spoke about concerns regarding the transparency in the transportation of weapons between countries. The delegate emphasised that any such movement of arms must be monitored carefully by all the countries concerned.

A delegate abandoned diplomacy and began singing Barbie Girl at the start of their speech, leaving the committee questioning whether they were attending a crisis session or a talent show.

#### UPDATE 1:

Delegates, recent intelligence reports have exposed “Agency YAGER,” a covert organization attached with the creation of the biochemical weapon “Absolute Sulphur.”

Evidence suggests that multiple states were producing separate accessories of the weapon through secret facilities.

These components were reportedly transferred under American supervision for final assembly within US-controlled operations.

However, it remains unclear whether participating nations fully understood the nature of the project.

Analysts warn that this could signal a dangerous new era in modern warfare.

#### UPDATE 2:

The deployment of “Absolute Sulphur” near the South Sariwon rail junction has raised questions after South Korean casualties far exceeded North Korean losses.

Investigators found strange violet residue across the affected area, while intercepted Soviet signals suggest North Korea may have been warned before the attack. Analysts now fear that someone in “Agency YAGER” may have leaked information from the inside.

We have come across what claims to be the charter of the agency yager-

# UNHGA-SPECPOL

Today, the 16th of May, LMC MUN 2026 officially began and with it all committees commenced their sessions. While every committee had an impressive start by far the most mind-boggling and intriguing opening belonged to the UNHGA (SPECPOL).

The committee began with a trailer that truly proved why SPECPOL is the committee where delegates should “expect the unexpected.” The trailer contained six hidden updates, leaving delegates in complete shock and anticipation.

Following the trailer, the Executive Board conducted a 10-minute informal ice-breaking session during which delegates clarified doubts and attempted to guess the hidden updates. This interactive session helped energize the committee and encouraged participation.

The committee then officially proceeded with delegates delivering GSLs one after another while paperwork circulated rapidly throughout the room. At one point, the pace of debate became so intense that it was difficult to keep up.

After several engaging speeches and debates, the committee finally moved into a break session. However, before the break, delegates participated in an open floor discussion — or, as many delegates jokingly referred to it, “Screaming Hour.”

The committee resumed with the delegation of Israel telling all oppositions that there is “no use for this unity.”

The update which changed the entire course of committee. was played in the voice of a man whose identity was not disclosed. He said that a country which has a blue star in its flag and another country with a red flag with stars on the side have planned to conduct the assassination of the man seen in the first update.

The committee then moved into an Unmoderated caucus for two minutes followed by an open floor for eight minutes discussing the new update and expressing their views and interpretations on the update. There were establishments of new alliances including USSR and China on one bloc and France and Israel on the other.

Delegate of US debarred for using abusive language.

UPDATE: The United Nations headquarters has been hijacked and the Heads of all states are now under captivity of the hijackers. The committee moved into an unmoderated caucus for ten minutes for lobbying with regards to the latest and last update for the day.

Voting via chits started each voting for 2 delegations . The 6 representatives elected to negotiate are: Syria, Israel, North Yemen, Egypt and The United Kingdom. Negotiation is in progress and the EB as the negotiators is making demands to the negotiators. The condition was that for each demand not met one head of state will be beheaded.

The first condition was to release the prisoners of war. The second condition being the demand of an aircraft carrier with crew and enough artillery to blow up a nation by next day morning. The other demands included a seat at The United Nations and the son-in-law of Egyptian former president to be handed over including the access to nuclear weapons. The last demand was negotiated to be missiles instead of nuclear weapons. With the negotiation being completed, the Committee ended.



# UNFSC

The opening session of the UNFSC was full of controversies, arguments, war discussions and most importantly, innumerable updates. Unlike other committees, UNFSC decided to start with a bang right away, with an update that the Fremen (gigantic worms also known as “veinwalkers” and labelling themselves as the guardians of planet Mars) entered American Martian territory, destroying infrastructure but not killing anyone. Americans found one of the objects from the sky and were able to decipher that it had yellow stars on its body. After this, the committee resumed as usual, roll call took place, and a motion for the general speaker’s list was passed. The first general speaker’s list was the Delegates of the United States of America. In this speech, America posed itself as the mediator or the peacemaker to resolve the ongoing issues and secure a peaceful future for humanity on Mars. This was followed by the speeches of delegates of the Netherlands and France, who spoke about the violation of policies by other countries. Then came Turkey, which asked a simple question inquiring if the mere act of landing upon a planet or the placement of a banner provides a country with inherent jurisdictional rights or territorial possession. Then came a pivotal moment when the second update was introduced, which said that there were tectonic explosions at the base of Mount Olympus Mons on Mars, accompanied by an electromagnetic signal that disrupted satellites in low orbit. Moreover, following this, colonies situated within the Tharsis plateau area documented tremors, particulate clouds, and a momentary power loss occurring just before the explosions. Following this, The Delegate of Syria started his speech with an explosion, saying, “It is God's job to forgive my enemies, and it is my job to send them to Him.” He went on to dominate the United States of America, listing several international treaties that were breached by the United States of America because of the Electromagnetic waves that accompanied the explosion at the base of Mount Olympus, which he believed had been emitted from the USA’s WMD reservoirs on Mars. This was followed by an Open Floor, which was highly chaotic with loud desk banging, shouting and tense cross-talk. Instead of focusing on finding solutions, the delegates kept trying to find points so that they were able to continue the arguments. The open floor was interrupted by two updates. The first update mentioned the discovery of a new Artificial Intelligence called Arrakis Intelligence made by Sam Sciitar, whose powerful firewall prevented I.P. tracking. The second update mentioned the circulation of newspapers of an organisation called “The Eternal Truth”. It said that the publications tried to tame the Fremen and was written in an ancient dialect, one which mankind had not deciphered. .

This was followed by a speech by the delegates of Russia, followed by a presidential statement by the delegates of the Democratic Republic of Korea(DPRK), the delegates of China and the delegates of Russia. Another update said that DPRK intelligence forces were convincing their civilians and the civilians of Japan and South Korea to join the Fremen. After this came the all-important splitting of the entire committee into two blocs, the War and Power Bloc. The War bloc was led by the USA and Israel, whereas the Power bloc was led by Russia, China and DPRK. What happened after this was a blur of Auction of several severely powerful weapons, open floors and updates. The committee did not move in a positive direction in the sense that the pointing fingers at each other continued, and the open floor remained largely unproductive. It was clearly evident that the Power bloc was much more efficient and sensible in managing the money allotted to them for the auction, but they were unable to identify which items would actually be useful and which would not be as heavy-hitting. Towards the end, the delegates were given the task of writing action orders in which both the Power and War blocs were excellent in the way they used their weapons. To mention a key moment, I have to mention the revival of Genghis Khan and his taking over 20% of the War bloc's troops. The chairs decided to end the committee with an even bigger bang than they began with. Everyone's delegation was replaced, and the committee became one of the Greek gods. The key point to be noted is that they will be granted use of their respective powers



# COUNCIL OF EASTERN KINGDOM

The committee started with an atmosphere of vigour and enthusiasm. Roll call was taken, and motions were thrown on the floor. A motion to move into a formal debate was declared by the EB. The debate commenced with the delegate of Venice declaring the cause of the attack on the Hagia Sophia Cathedral as “Ottoman Influence”. Following this, powerful words spoken by the delegate of Genova stated, “LET US STOP PRETENDING THIS IS ABOUT WAR, HONOUR OR EVEN CIVILIZATION, THIS... IS ABOUT POWER, CONTROL OVER CONSTANTINOPLE”. Genova said that Constantinople is not a city; it is a lock to the world’s economy. And that every single delegate in the room wanted the key to it. They agreed to open the harbour and protect Constantinople, but at the same time openly threatened to give them a tit for tat if they betray Genova. Next, the Eastern Kingdom shifted the debate towards religion by mentioning that “the Ottoman Empire is no longer fighting the military world, they were attacking religious beliefs. They blamed the Ottoman Empire for designing the Hagia Sophia incident to purposely spread panic”. In a heated discussion, the delegate of Naples blatantly called all the delegates in the committee “illiterate and uneducated”, which was followed by a wave of outrage by the Council. A right to reply was announced, and the delegate of Naples was hurled with a series of insults and criticised. This was the most heated discussion of the session, where even the EB struggled to maintain order. A short open floor followed, where delegates discussed the religious war. The Ottoman Empire said, “The Byzantine Empire cannot even handle their own civil war, how will they handle an entire kingdom?”. Others in the committee claimed this to be a planned strategy to divide the Christians. Following this was a lengthy unmoderated caucus for the council to form a unanimous directive. Much to everyone’s disappointment, the directive was scrapped by the EB because of a lack of definitions and several false claims. Consequently, a group of catholic merchants began protesting violently in front of a church, with chants and demands, representing a group of catholic merchants. They demanded the removal of unfairly high customs duties and passage taxes, leading to anger among Catholic communities. Enraged by this atrocity, the delegate of the Ottoman Empire stated, “It's time when all Western powers should come together and kick these jokers” on the open floor. Next, an update was introduced in the committee. The delegates gathered up to inspect a ceramic bowl with distinct engravings and motives. The delegate of the Kingdom of Bohemia proclaimed that the tulip was the official symbol of the Ottoman Empire, blaming them for the brutalities committed in the Hagia Sophia Cathedral. .

Another major turning point came when the Sultan of the Ottoman Empire attempted to send a letter to the leader of the Orthodox Christians, but it was intercepted by EB before it could reach its destination. It was a message of distress requesting the orthodox Christians to spread a message for him all across Rome. This was followed by a moderated caucus of fifteen speakers, discussing this update, where the Crimean Khanate declared the Ottomans as an economic threat to every single person in the economy. The Duchy of Savoy blamed the Byzantine Empire for deliberately increasing the price of trade routes, creating internal strife. They termed this as “calculated warfare, the most dangerous form of warfare”. Session 2 began with an update - the catholic committees wanted the Hagia Sophia to be returned to the right side(to become catholic again), followed by a heated open floor. The arguments had reached a level where the EB had to clear that this was not a war cabinet. This was followed by another update - The delegates had to search the committee hall for an opportunity to betray their kingdom and change their allotment. 3 blank placards were to be searched. 2 had already been found by the delegates, but then the EB realised that they had forgotten to hide the 3rd one. All the delegates were then asked to close their eyes until the EB hid it. Only one would actually get to change their allotment. The opportunity was grabbed by the delegate of Venice, whose allotment was changed to the Holy Roman Empire. This had changed the bloc dynamics. The Holy Roman Empire, in its speech, declared that it would never be a part of the Ottoman Empire. To this, the Ottoman Empire replied by calling the Holy Roman Empire a “joker with an incompetent state”. The session concluded with an update that the Catholic Worshippers were trapped inside the Church of Hagia Sophia with no access to food and water. The door was not opening even after multiple tries. This was declared as a Humanitarian Emergency.



# CONGRESS OF VIENNA

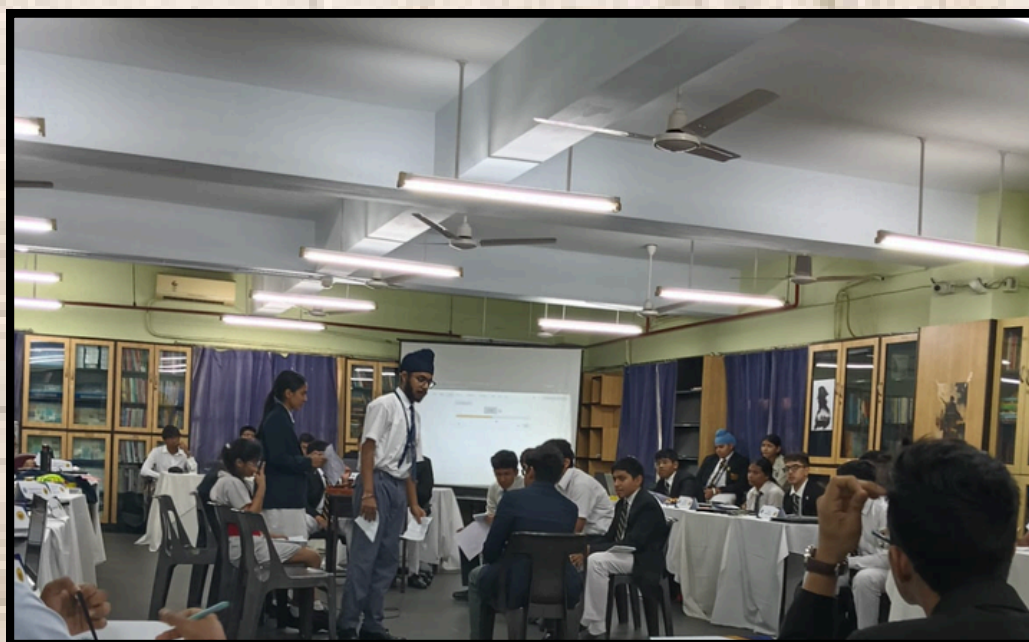
The Congress of Vienna convened for its first session, with Frederick William III of Prussia stepping in as a replacement delegate at the outset. The General Speakers List saw Barclay de Tolly raise the spectre of Napoleon's supposed escape, disputed sharply by the floor. Pedro de Sousa Holstein of Portugal called for a true balance of power, declaring "peace must prevail," though his remarks on Poland and Brazil drew contestation. Louis XVIII dismissed claims of loyalty to Austria as groundless. He blamed Napoleon for the ongoing crisis. Emmerich Joseph de Dalberg argued that punishment had never been a useful path to peace. Alexander, I suggested limits on temporary sovereignty, but several delegates questioned his credibility.

The session grew volatile when the general debate opened. Delegate Edouard Mortier raised a matter gripping the chamber, playing cards, specifically the Ace, King, and Queen of Spades, alongside a wildcard Joker, appearing as coded symbols of a coordinated threat believed to originate with Napoleon. "More cards to come," warned one delegate. The floor demanded Napoleon be located. Delegates were then directed to look beneath their desks, where wax-sealed envelopes containing secret individual objectives awaited each of them. The Executive Board confirmed that spies were present among the delegations, working against their own countries. An anonymous letter alleged the Pope had been taken captive by members of the Grand Army. A separate intercepted letter alleged Emperor Francis I of Austria was of Russian origin, with the floor insisting a Russian could not rule Austria. Reports also emerged of five generals murdered in Spain, each scene marked by a Ten of Spades, a note reading "Austrian blood gives me power," and the seal of the Congress of Vienna itself, suggesting the perpetrator had direct access to the Congress. Another letter then arrived: "The Joker has escaped. Thirteen stars may find me now." Delegates linked the thirteen stars to the United States, accusing the republic of aiding Napoleon. Reports from Moscow meanwhile, placed Rasputin meeting a man in deep red military attire before both vanished into a warehouse.

The session's most consequential development was the trial of Prince George Augustus Frederick of Britain. Louis Alexandre Berthier's Proposal of Trial, bearing fifteen signatories, charged the Prince with drug dealing and entering a secret arrangement with the United States, with both men's lives as the stakes. The prosecution's key witness claimed to have seen a white powdery substance aboard an American vessel, while a second admitted seeing both American and British flags but, when pressed on the location, claimed to have observed events from an

estate two hundred kilometres away. His credibility collapsed entirely. The defence argued the case was driven by a personal grudge and fabricated to remove a political threat. The Prince himself refused to apologise: "I am the Prince of England. I do not apologise to anyone." The defence rested on the principle that guilt must be proven, not innocence. The Prince was acquitted. Louis Alexandre Berthier was sentenced to death by hanging.

In conclusion, the first day of the Congress revealed a chamber far more consumed by conspiracy than diplomacy. Spies, secret envelopes, murdered generals, and a trial ending in execution defined a session meant to build a new European order. Delegates emerged with more questions than answers, and trust within the room is already in short supply.



# IHPC

The committee took their seats, eager yet determined to express their views and passionately defend them. Eagerness was present in the expressions of the delegates, knowing this was the opportunity to establish their notions.

The meeting proceeded with the usual passing of motions, with the agenda being to discuss the orbit of Yuri Gagarin around the earth. The GSL began, with members making important statements. Komsomolskaya Pravda claims that the USA turns human achievements into propaganda, causing fear and doubt in the world instead of celebrating historical milestones. MENA raises a point that the USSR uses scientific achievement as an instrument to instill their ideologies, with the VOA questioning why Yuri Gagarin was presented as a political role model, not just as a cosmonaut to young citizen and claims that the USSR was pushing the message that they were not just progressing in science but leading humanity and affirmed communism was superior. “They did not just want the world to see the stars, they wanted the world to kneel to the story they wrote about the stars,” the VOA firmly concludes. Pravda refutes the statement with a question, and VOA claims that they merely spoke the truth, not propaganda.

An update occurs, informing the committee of a dossier from PAP, accusing Pravda of forcing Yuri Gagarin to give scripted interviews, and him being forced to remain silent for his family after having to jump from the spacecraft to not die. An audio transcript of Gagarin testifying this was provided. Pravda defends that no evidence was provided, and the audio transcript was not verified and could be fake.

The two Blocs then argued in open floor, heatedly debating their views on the revealed information, with the Right Bloc supporting the USSR saying that no evidence was provided for such claims and the opposing Left Bloc believing and supporting PAP’s accusation.

A trial was conducted between the Right Bloc–Pravda, ADN and Komsomolskaya Pravda,–and the Left Bloc–PAP, Washington Post and UPI. While presenting their arguments and accusations to the chair, the Left Bloc said that Gagarin was forced to be silent and had faced life threatening situations during the landing of the spacecraft which caused him to use a parachute and jump off of it. They also questioned why the USSR themselves had not let Gagarin testify against their statements, and they claimed that most of their military budget went into space travel. The Right Bloc denies their allegations, saying that Gagarin needed time to recover from space travel and their claims were false. The trial ended with the Right Bloc emerging victorious.

An update emerged—an anonymous source revealed that due to Gagarin's success and tensions of the Cold War, the USA forced its scientists to work on sending astronauts to space. In a trial launch, a man, Edward Jones, had lost his life. The New York Times and Nova Street Press Agency knew and tried to publish it, but they were obstructed. Each news agency passed its opinion on it, some criticising the US for its hypocrisy, like keeping secrets despite criticising the USSR for doing so, and their competition for superiority costing a life. Meanwhile, others claimed that an anonymous source was not reliable and could be propaganda, and there was a possibility that the death could have also been caused by natural causes. Yet many claimed that this was not real journalism—concealing real facts—and that space exploration was losing its real purpose.

The GSL resumed. The CNA talks about how the media shapes global views, and how journalism being independent and being on the right side of history was important. A point was raised that CNA was controlled by the Taiwanese Government during the Korean War.

The Washington Post defended itself and said that it had tried to be credible and report the truth whenever possible, and it requested a private investigation team to look into the death of Edward Jones.

MENA claims that they support the notion of truth rather than Egypt's policies shaped by Arab nationalism, rejecting subordination to the government. MENA was questioned for underreporting the Egyptian military weakness in 1956. Navostri emphasises the USA's hypocrisy and the selective journalism in the USA, all while criticising the USSR for doing so.

And with these statements, the committee proceedings came to an end, but their lingering fervour was still not extinguished.



# ECOB

The Emergency Court of Bengal enters into its first session with great enthusiasm and pertinent matters up for discussion, primarily concerning threats and conspiracies in Bengal, such as the looming danger of an Afghan invasion, pirates and European powers, as well as growing tensions, such as the cult– Roktoheen and the mysterious inflow of adulterated sugar into the kingdom. This committee is not just a mere sequence of debate; it is the hand that holds the fate of Bengal.

The committee session for the political crisis in Bengal started off with intense debating on the quagmire of betrayal and alliances with foreign powers. Throughout the flow of the committee, there were major concerns expressed over the growing political, military and economic power gained by the British and French. Accusations were thrown at delegates for prioritising personal ambition over the state's growth. The council began with the initiation ceremony led by the delegates of Mir Madan to join their cult, where they pledged their allegiance by taking an oath and drinking blood to prove their loyalty and honour to their sect. Their fingerprints were then stamped on paper proving that they were in their cult, and they couldn't back out. The General Speakers' List enabled delegates to give crucial proclamations. Notably, Swaroop Chand, in his speech, declared that he converted to Islam and would still be stationed at Plassey.

A major point of discussion was the agreement signed between Mir Jafar and Robert Clive. Under this agreement, Clive agreed to transfer operational control of his military forces to Mir Jafar. Additionally, it was said that there were alterations in the Bengal leadership roles; Mir Jafar would be formally recognised as the nawab. This update was marred by considerable controversy, with several delegates questioning both the legal and political issues caused by this agreement.

Further debate arose regarding the legal implications, specifically the Sharia law. It was clarified by the Executive Board, stating that although historical legal systems could be referenced for contextual purposes, it had no authority over the committee decisions. The committee intensified as accusations were thrown at each other, with people debating the hypocrisy of the agreement signed.

A significant update involved a distressed letter, allegedly signed by Mehtab Chand, elaborating on how he went into hiding due to death threats by his own brother. As a result, there was the wealth of the family was compromised as there was no legal heir. This created financial instability in Bengal, which created newer alliances. Omi Chand proposed to personally pay the outstanding dues to prevent a Maratha invasion.

The committee also addressed major crises like food contamination, accusations regarding the poisoning of Bengal's population through adulterated sugar and opium-based substances, to which delegates proposed stricter cargo inspections, regulation of trade routes and careful foreign trades.

In the last moments before suspension of the committee for Day One, a major military update declared that the French had successfully defeated pirate forces in the bay area, thus reopening trade routes. However, the Afghans were persistent with their use of military prowess, forcing the committee to negotiate with the Afghan representatives and the Ahom kingdom.

The session concluded with the delegates divided into negotiating teams, highlighting the urgency to form alliances to preserve Bengal's sovereignty and prevent further collapse.



# PCPSU

The committee began with a bang as everyone just discovered that Alexandra was the daughter of Vladimir Lenin. The general roll call began followed by the motion of a general speakers list being raised by Nicholai. Grigory began by saying that Lenin built the Politburo for everyone. It had contributed in making essential policies and a huge improvement in the agriculture. He believed that Lenin's death was a planned homicide. Following this, Maria, the sister of Lenin, made a demand of an independent investigation team to find out the truth about her brother's death. "*If the revolution cannot protect its own architect, what does it say about the state?*" Kalinin questioned her authority to organise an independent investigation team.

Suddenly, we got an update about a GPU investigation, that discovered that the letters sent through an unknown man to the Politburo were formulated by Alexi Rikhov. Kalinin demanded for the power to make the country a better place due to his experience and allegiance to Lenin from the beginning. "*I thought USSR was enough to fill the vacuum he left behind.*" He was then questioned about why Lenin called him incapable during Lenin's last moments which Kalinin termed delusional due to Lenin's mental situation back then. "*What Lenin said during his last moments is not valid.*" Leon Trotsky on taking the stage made some fiery comments. "*You may debate in your warm offices but that won't help.*" "*Today I stand in a communist state tomorrow I want to stand in a communist world.*" During his speech the committee was informed of another update.

On the morning of 23rd January 1924, during the sealed personal clearance of Lenin's private study at Gorki, GPU Chairman Felix Dzerzhinsky discovered a hidden compartment near Lenin's primary desk concealed behind a disturbed row of political journals - an irregularity immediately notable given Lenin's well-known meticulous habits. Within this compartment lay Lenin's private hand-carved chessboard, preserved in an alarming final arrangement: The almost fallen white king attacked by the rook with another looming at the back in the shadows. A white queen standing exposed, under simultaneous pressure of two black knights. GPU cryptographic analysts believe this may represent a deliberate symbolic cipher composed by Lenin during his final coherent weeks.

Furthermore, Lenin's personal private notes, spanning dates from December 1923 through January 1924, found in his study drawer, revealed increasing alarm regarding his final visitors and treatment. Entries mention that approximately two weeks before his death, "the first came with politics," followed days later by "others bearing counsel," but during his final week, Lenin repeatedly recorded that "the familiar one returns alone." One disturbing note dated 17 January 1924 states: "His visits are frequent now. He speaks softly, but I sense another standing behind his words." Additional entries reference "ancient remedies," "the old poison hidden in care," and "modern power guided by older hands." On 19 January 1924, Lenin wrote: "I am treated, yet I fade too swiftly. This is not merely sickness." Medical supply ledgers from the same period reveal several irregular sealed deliveries into Lenin's restricted treatment zone between 16 January and 20 January, including undocumented botanical compounds and unexplained revisions to treatment records. One full page covering treatment administered immediately before Lenin's final collapse on 21 January 1924 was found missing. Lenin's final unfinished note, believed to have been written within 48 hours of his death, read only: "I fear not L.B.R...but what force moves quietly beside him."

Leon continued with his speech about the positive aspects of communism. "The beacon of hope that guided our principles is dead." He ended his speech by saying, "I am Communism." An unmoderated caucus was in motion for the next five minutes. The updates were too heavy to handle. Following this, the committee moved into an open floor for fifteen minutes. They discussed about the importance of the chess pieces' place on the chessboard. A new update was announced. After Lenin's death, Krupskaya privately uncovered a series of sealed journals, hidden operational files, and classified memoranda buried within Lenin's personal archives that exposed the existence of a deeply secret alliance between Lenin, Stalin, and Trotsky known only as the LST.

Within these concealed records, she discovered Project ZARYA, a covert revolutionary program created under the guise of state protection but in reality, designed to build an autonomous force of psychologically conditioned operatives. Through orphan recruitment, war survivor conscription, chemical dependency, neurological conditioning, and ideological erasure, thousands were transformed into obedient instruments embedded across Soviet railways, industry, communications, and enforcement systems. As Krupskaya continued piecing together the fragmented evidence, Lenin's later writings revealed growing horror at the project's evolution, suggesting that what began as an emergency safeguard had become a terrifying machine for political domination.

Most chilling was the references to Directive 47, an advanced branch of ZARYA tied to silent neurological assassination methods. Cross-referencing these files with Lenin's unexplained medical deterioration, Krupskaya came to believe that Lenin was not merely a victim of illness, but may have been deliberately eliminated by the very system he helped create.

The open floor continued, now discussing the new information. Leon Trotsky ratified that the trifecta, LST, was in existence, but it did not use the neurological methods on children. Whereas Joseph Stalin denied the fact of the LST ever existing. Leon accepted that he had taken the orphans to teach them about communism and nothing more. The committee was informed about a new update. Newly restricted findings from the continued examination of Lenin's body have revealed a deeply unsettling discovery of traces of a poisonous plant called henbane that were present within his bloodstream at the time of death. Though subtle in quantity, Soviet medical authorities now privately acknowledge that this toxic herb, historically linked not only to poison but to ancient European ritualistic practices and methods of unnatural manipulation, may have played a critical role in accelerating Lenin's final neurological collapse. In a man already weakened, such a substance could have silently transformed frailty into death. These revelations have cast a darker shadow over Lenin's final weeks. Furthermore, records from household staff, medical attendants, and family sources indicate that approximately two weeks before his death, Lenin was visited privately by Joseph Stalin. In the following days, separate meetings were held with Leon Trotsky and Grigory Zinoviev. Yet most disturbing are reports that during Lenin's final week, as his condition worsened rapidly, he held a series of highly secretive and exclusive private meetings with Lev Kamenev alone. Access was tightly restricted, records remain incomplete, and the contents of these meetings are unknown, even by Lenin's own wife, Krupskaya.

The committee was informed of an incident occurring near Gorki. A peasant's son's injury was healed by a mysterious man, which led to the protests against the Politburo, calling it a useless body. Another open floor was in motion, which was for fifteen minutes. The GPU informed the committee of having found the identity of LBR (Lev Borisovich Rosenfeld). After this, an incident of peasants meeting a mysterious, tall, thin and piercing-eyed man who had a deeply unsettling presence. The open floor was hereafter resumed for four minutes. Gregory brought up how Henbane was grown in Siberia, and Rasputin was born in Siberia. As soon as the open floor elapsed, new information was discovered. Krupskaya had contacted this mysterious man to bring back Lenin from the dead.

The ritual went astray and, in the end, Krupskaya's soul had been transferred to Lenin's body while her body had been burned. Krupskaya did not have Lenin's memories; she only had her own memories combined with Lenin's intelligence. She was given the name of Kenin. A new open floor for five minutes was in motion. There was a new update on the chessboard; the chess pieces had moved to their places on their own. Shocking news revealed, the one managing the committee for the past six hours was actually Lev Kamenev and Rasputin was brought in as his accomplice. Lev was the one who had assassinated Lenin, and Rasputin had left him alone, vanishing in the shadows. Shockingly, Leon had held Kenin captive. Due to Kamenev's act of betrayal, he was put on a LID (Leninist Integrity Directive) Session where Stalin defended Kamenev, while Alexandra and Alexi were the prosecutors. Alexi alleged Kamenev of violating a certain number of articles in the Soviet Criminal Code. Despite Stalin's attempts to save him by the discretion of the judge, Kamenev was hanged, marking the end of the committee
